POSITION OVERVIEW

Friends of the National Arboretum (FONA) seeks a Youth Programs Educator to support our Green Ambassadors Program and SPROUT programs. You will have the opportunity to build garden knowledge; learn new facilitation, teaching and group management techniques; and work with young people from PK- high school.

As an assistant to our SPROUT (Science Program Reaching Out) program, you will provide self-guided or staff-led ninety minute interactive garden science experiences that are based on one of our themes: pollination, garden basics and nutrition to primarily elementary aged students.

As an assistant to our Green Ambassadors Program (GAP), a six-week paid summer internship for DC high school students, you will teach hands-on skills such as gardening, cooking, and carpentry as well as interpersonal skills like communication and collaboration.

ABOUT US

Friends of the National Arboretum (FONA) is a nonprofit membership organization working to preserve and enhance the U.S. National Arboretum (USNA) in Washington D.C. and bring this remarkable resource to life as an important part of the city and region.

The primary program of FONA is the Washington Youth Garden. Founded in 1971, the Washington Youth Garden provides unique environmental science and nutrition education programming for youth and families. The mission of the Washington Youth Garden is to nurture curious minds and healthy bodies by connecting youth to food, the land, and each other.

Our small program team is a little community in itself, mixed with different personalities, cultures, gifts and talents. Everything from mushroom cultivation to bread making. There's always something to learn from everyone. We enjoy lending each other a hand on projects and listening to each other for feedback and suggestions.

ABOUT YOU

You are someone who loves engaging with both elementary and high school aged students and are excited about leading garden-based activities. You are comfortable working outside, and enjoy getting your hands dirty (literally- we work in gardens 70% of the year) and crave variety in your day to day. You love thinking through the best way to craft an experience for students of all ages, and working independently and with your peers to lead programs. You have good organizational skills, and are willing to take initiative to ensure all WYG programs run smoothly.

The ideal candidate will have experience, but more importantly interest, in the following:

- Informal, garden-based teaching of children (aged 3-13)
- Youth development (ages 14-21)

- Supporting experiential education (cooking, small construction projects, gardening, etc.)
- Familiarity and connection with Black, Latine, and/or marginalized communities in D.C.
- Spanish language proficiency
- Using Google Drive and Microsoft Office
- Can lift/ handle up to 40 lbs

Expected certificates and licenses:

- Driver's License
- First Aid (can attain through professional development after hire)
- COVID-19 proof of vaccination or proof of a medical or religious exemption

Prior to employment, FONA will conduct a background check, including criminal and sexual offender checks and education and employment verification.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

While there is a lot of seasonal variability in this work, averaged over the course of the growing season, we expect the Youth Programs Educator to be spending the approximate percentage of time on different functions:

- School Garden Support Programs (50%)
 - SPROUT
 - Heavily weighted to spring (March-June) and fall (September-November)
 - Lead students (10 max) in 90-120 minute hands-on garden activities through SPROUT program
 - Lead orientations for self-guided groups up to 60 students
 - Set-up and clean-up responsibilities
 - Maintain educational materials and educational spaces
 - Assist with program coordination and design, particularly of new self-guided components
 - Engage arboretum visitors and classes to answer questions about the garden
 - School Garden Supports
 - Support and co-facilitate school-based events such as, workdays, cooking demonstrations and taste tests, garden clubs, family nights, etc.
 - Support creation of resources and materials for events and trainings

• Green Ambassadors high school internship Program (45%)

- Program Development (10%); heavily weighted to spring
 - Work in partnership with On-Site Program Manager and Garden Manager to design GAP Farm Crew schedule
 - Implement recruiting efforts for GAP participants, including:
 - Support with outreach tables at school and community events
 - Offer short interviews to interested participants
 - Follow up with candidates over email and text message

- Lead orientation events at WYG demonstration garden
- GAP Farm Crew Implementation (30%)
 - Collaborate with On-Site Program Manager to coordinate logistics, including organizing paperwork and payroll, driving a 15- passenger van and/ or pickup truck, and coordinating with partner organizations;
 - Facilitate program orientation for youth and provide daily supervision;
 - Track Green Ambassador commitment to program standards of conduct;
 - Demonstrate consistent communication skills, positive attitude, and work ethic
 - Deliver workshops and facilitate informal learning throughout 6-week program;
 - Assist with program documentation and storytelling
- Saturday Volunteer Days (10%)
 - Manage Saturday volunteer programs for the youth
 - Support general volunteer days
 - Communicate participant availability
 - Manage community service hours timesheets and submission
 - Assist in garden maintenance support
 - Meet with garden staff to plan volunteer efforts
- FONA-wide Responsibilities (5%)
 - Act as an ambassador for FONA, present gardening and garden education workshops at conferences and teacher trainings;
 - Occasionally attend fundraisers and other special events
 - Capture quality photos and videos of SPROUT, GAP
 - Perform garden maintenance tasks as time allows around programming

WORK SCHEDULE & COMPENSATION

Work schedule is normally Monday-Friday, 8:30-5:00 (some flexibility) with a shift to semi-regular Tuesday- Saturday required during the spring and fall season. Expected range is \$21-24- Salary is subject to FICA and income taxes. Excellent benefits package includes full health care coverage, a matching 401k retirement plan, paid federal holidays and generous accrued PTO, plus travel and cell phone/ internet reimbursement.

The expected start date is late March, 2023. Position concludes November 17th, 2023.

TRAVEL

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This position is based out of the U.S. National Arboretum, with extensive local travel utilizing a 15 passenger van or truck during the 6 week summer Green Ambassadors program, and weekly utilizing a truck throughout program.
